Attorney-Client Session
September 22, 2025

The City of Titusville City Council met in a special Attorney-Client (Executive) Session on Monday, September 22, 2025, at Titusville City Hall, second floor, Council Chamber, 555 South Washington Avenue, Titusville, Florida 32796. Those present were Mayor Andrew Connors, Vice-Mayor Herman A. Cole, Jr., Col USAF Retired, and City Council Members Megan Moscoso, Jo Lynn Nelson, and Dr. Sarah Stoeckel. Also, present were City Manager Thomas Abbate, Interim City Attorney James Stokes, and Assistant City Clerk Jolynn Donhoff.

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Mayor Connors opened the public meeting at 5:30 p.m. He read aloud legally required information on the purpose and scope of the Special City Council meeting. The special meeting was called to hold an Attorney-Client Session to discuss pending litigation regarding *LISTON, ET AL. v. CITY OF TITUSVILLE, ET AL.*, Case No. 05-2024-Ca-050881 (In the Circuit Court of the Eighteenth Judicial Circuit in and for Brevard County, Florida). Mayor Connors advised that as provided for in *Florida Statutes* Section 286.011(8), the Attorney-Client Session would open to the public in the City Council Chambers then recess to a private Attorney-Client Session in the Round Room Conference Room, on the first floor of City Hall, to discuss the pending litigation.

Mayor Connors further advised the attendees at the private Attorney-Client Session included himself, Mayor Andrew Connors, Vice-Mayor Herman A. Cole, Jr., City Council Members, Megan Moscoso, Jo Lynn Nelson, and Sarah Stoeckel, City Manager Thomas Abbate, Interim City Attorney James Stokes, Litigation Counsel Ramon Vazquez, and a certified court reporter.

In addition, Mayor Connors advised the private Attorney-Client Session was anticipated to last for approximately one (1) hour; however, the session may continue, so long as the members of the City Council determined was necessary. At the conclusion of the private Attorney-Client Session, the Attorney-Client Session shall reopen and be adjourned in the City Council Chambers, on the second floor of Titusville City Hall, in accordance with *Florida Statutes* Section 286.011(8).

At 6:07 p.m. and at the conclusion of the private Attorney-Client Session, Mayor Connors reopened the meeting in the Council Chamber on the second floor of Titusville City Hall. Mayor Connors subsequently announced the termination of the special Attorney-Client Session and with no further business to discuss, the meeting adjourned at 6:08 p.m.
